

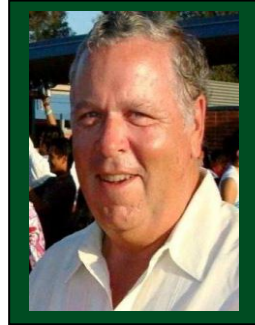

On Tuesday, November 3, 2015, Br. Charlie Jackson, SJ shared his deeply personal vocation story with our Serra Club members.

On his way home from high school one day, his heart leapt for joy in a way that it had never done, and he had the deep sense that he was being called by God to be a Jesuit. First of all he immediately associated this event with being lifted up, embraced and loved by none other than God. He had been currently attending a Catholic Jesuit school. His call was specific in that he was being called to be a Jesuit. Subsequent to this event, nothing changed for at least a year. He did nothing about this call. He had discerned that he had been called to be a Jesuit. His doing nothing was unknowingly confirming this discernment. If his experience had been of human origin, it would have soon vanished from his mind, but if it was of God, it would develop clarity and focus, and that is exactly what happened! Not only had the idea not vanished, it had significantly grown. Publications that were sent to him when he first communicated to the seminary were even part of his discernment. He began to feel very excited about his new venture. During his junior year, he was able to discriminate between a call to the priesthood and being a Jesuit. With only guidance by God, he had been able to discern this difference on his own. He was very attracted to becoming a Jesuit brother. He wanted to be a supportive member of the brotherhood, and he developed the skills of a carpenter. The photos of the brothers doing their great variety of tasks gave him a sense of what his life might become as part of a Jesuit community. Br. Charlie Jackson went on to poignantly describe the day that he entered the community (August 7<sup>th</sup>) and the tearful farewell to his family, followed by the warm acceptance of the Jesuit community. A day he will never forget! Thank you, Br. Charlie for sharing such a beautiful and intimate experience in your life!

Club News

On November 17, 2015, Brigid Noonan did a presentation regarding the Society of St Vincent de Paul, educating us as to their history and the work that they do. It was very informative, and below are some of the highlights. Just FYI, this year at Thanksgiving, Holy Family Parish distributed 150 Thanksgiving meals, everything included for a family to enjoy a Thanksgiving meal.




St. Vincent founded 3 organizations: Confraternities of Charity in 1617, Congregation of the Mission in 1625, and he and St. Louise de Marillac co-founded the Daughters of Charity in 1633. All 3 groups have weathered periods of growth, decline, persecution and renewal, but all three organizations are still very much alive today. In 1833, Frederic Ozanam established the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. Blessed Frederic saw the Society established in many countries, including the US, Canada and Mexico. Members of the Society went 2 by 2 to the homes of the poor to respond to their needs, a practice which is still happening today.

More about Frederic Ozanam:

In 1830, he began his studies at the Sorbonne in Paris to pursue a law degree. He became acquainted with the publisher of a Catholic newspaper. Soon after, Frederic joined a student organization. They met on Saturdays and discussed a wide variety of subjects, except politics. One Saturday, there was a heated verbal exchange; Ozanam and his friends were challenged. They were told: "We agree that one time your Church was a great Church and was a great source of good. But what is your Church doing now? What is she doing for the poor? Show us your works and we will believe you". Ozanam accepted the challenge. He and his 5 friends met. "We must do what is agreeable to God. Therefore, we must do what our Lord Jesus Christ did when preaching the gospel. Let us go to the poor". And so, in the Providence of God, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul was born. Their group chose St. Vincent de Paul as their patron because his name was almost synonymous with charity. The Church has called him the "Apostle of Charity" and the "Father of the Poor".

The primary goal of the Society is the spiritual growth of its members. They offer person-to-person service to those who are needy and suffering. In the Diocese of Orange St. V de P is in 45 parishes. At Holy Family they are open 5 days a week. They provide services such as a food drive, a food pantry, they take calls from the needy, and assist the homeless. Thank you, Brigid, for informing us regarding this very valuable ministry.
