President's Message *by Pete Philp*

Dear Serrans,

The 67th Serra International Convention in Omaha was a very humbling and spiritually uplifting experience for me. I was in awe of the many dedicated, knowledgeable and experienced Serrans from around the globe. We had four Masses each celebrated by a different archbishop or bishop. The Masses were concelebrated by as many as six other archbishops and bishops. At one Mass there were four archbishops in attendance. The Masses were also attended by 30 to 50 priests, deacons and seminarians. Different local choirs were featured at each Mass.

The outgoing Serra International President, Cesare Gambardella from Palermo, Sicily chronicled his visits to 14 countries, and 6 national councils. He met with 40 clubs, and chartered 17 new clubs. He reported that there are 45 new clubs in formation, and that Serra is on 6 continents. There are 18,176 Serrans worldwide. Of these 11,328 are in the United States. There are 658 clubs worldwide, 334 of which are in this country.

A highlight for me was the honoring of Ralph W. Hauenstein, who was 30 months from turning 100 years old. He has been a member of Serra since 1948, and was the 17th President of Serra International. He has attended more than 50 Serra International Conventions. He is the only surviving international president who knew personally the four founders of Serra. He was a Colonel in World War II and served as Chief of Intelligence on General Eisenhower's staff in the European Theatre of Operations. He has received high decorations from the Vatican, and from the United States, British and French governments.

By far the most entertaining and inspiring presentation was by Archbishop Timothy Dolan, Archbishop of New York, and new Episcopal Advisor to Serra International. Serra is fortunate to have him as our advisor. In another address Archbishop Elden Curtiss, retired Archbishop of Omaha, strongly stressed the need for better cooperation between USAC and Serra International, and the need to combine the Chicago based offices of each. I have ordered DVDs of these presentations, and we will try to provide an opportunity for all of our members to see them. Both presentations were outstanding.

The next Serra International Convention is in Anchorage, Alaska September 2-5, 2010. It's not too early to start thinking about combining a cruise with travel to the convention.

USCCB Pro-Life Committee Chairman Releases Statement For Respect Life Sunday

WASHINGTON—In a statement to mark Respect Life Sunday, October 4, Cardinal Justin Rigali of Philadelphia called attention to those who are most vulnerable in recent debates on health care reform – the unborn, the poor, the elderly and the immigrant – and called upon Catholics to “examine how well we, as a nation and individually, are living up to our obligation to protect the rights of those who, due to age, dependency, poverty or other circumstances, are at risk of their very lives.”

Cardinal Rigali chairs the Committee on Pro-Life Activities of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB).

Cardinal Rigali noted that the lives of the unborn are those most at risk in America and “despite the opposition of 67% of Americans to taxpayer-funded abortion, all current health care proposals being considered by Congress would allow or mandate abortion funding, either through premiums paid into government programs or out of federal revenues.”

Noting that the unborn are not alone in being under attack in current proposals, Cardinal Rigali called for health care that recognizes the humanity of the immigrant. “How can a just society deny basic health care to those living and working among us who need medical attention? It cannot and must not,” he said.

Cardinal Rigali also addressed a dangerous and false cultural attitude that some persons are not worth protecting because of their perceived “low quality of life.” He stated that “death is not a solution to life’s problems. Only those who are blind to the transcendent reality and meaning of human life could support killing human beings to mitigate economic, social or environmental problems.”

“The antidote to such myopia is to recover an appreciation for the sanctity and dignity of each unique human being,” he said.

Begun in 1972, the Respect Life Program stresses the value and dignity of human life. It is observed in the 195 Catholic dioceses in the United States.
