Chaplain's Corner - RETHINKING THE CATECHISM



On the Solemnity of the Assumption, August 15, 1997, Pope John Paul II promulgated the Latin typical edition of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Since that time until Saturday, August 20, 2016, a little more than nineteen years since its promulgation, I have thought of the Catechism of the Catholic Church as an excellent reference book for the Catholic Church. That was until I attended the Summer Catechetical Summit, sponsored by the Office of Faith Formation of the Diocese of Wichita. I had been told a professor from Steubenville University would be the keynote speaker and he was an excellent presenter and catechist. He did not disappoint. Dr. Petroc Willey opened my eyes to see the Catechism as an instrument of catechesis.

Dr. Willey began his talk by calling attention to Pope John Paul's Apostolic Constitution Fidei Depositum which is printed before the prologue to the Catechism. In that papal document the Holy Father desires that the "Deposit of Faith" is meant to be guarded by giving it away. The Catechism was written so that it can be shared with others. It seeks to educate the reader so they can know the faith, understand the faith, and share it with others. It tells us how to teach.

The prologue to the Catechism begins with three Scripture passages. They lay the foundation for this new found purpose of the Catechism being more than a reference book. The Catechism has been written to be a classic in spiritually. It is also the greatest teaching book (Jn. 17:3). A catechist can only teach as well as their relationship with Christ (1Tim. 2:3-4). Finally, the Catechism is about salvation (Acts 4:12).

The remainder of the talk Dr. Willey used the Catechism to teach us the title of the talk: "Eucharist: Source and Summit of Catechesis." Referencing various paragraphs of the Catechism, Dr. Willey enabled me to more fully understand what I am privileged to celebrate each day and share with so many others.

If you haven't picked up the Catechism of the Catholic Church for a long time I would encourage you to do so. Approach it not as a reference book to find a particular answer about our Catholic Faith, but rather read it as a spiritual classic in which one is enabled to fall more deeply in love with a God whom one understands more fully. Fr. Adam Keiter

'The growing face of the Church is Hispanic'

On Wednesday, August 17, Fr Adam Keiter spoke at our luncheon about one of his greatest loves and concerns- the importance of evangelizing the hispanic community.

As a seminarian, Fr Keiter was sent to Queretar, Mexico to study Spanish. At that point Fr. Matt McGinness, the vocations director, told him he would never be in Spanish ministry, not to worry! Adam came back not being able to speak well at all, and did not feel prepared when asked to give a homily in Spanish as Deacon Adam, in front of Bishop Jackels! Many prayers to the Holy Spirit were said on his way to the pulpit. Well, as you can see, Fr Matt was incorrect, and the Holy Spirit won- Fr Adam has been in Hispanic ministry since then.

Fr Adam stated that even though his administration does a nice job registering parishioners at the Cathedral, a great number of hispanics are not registered. "It's hard to get information out of hispanics for fear of deportation." He said a study done in 2014 showed that of those registered,



the Church comprised of 65% Anglo, and 35% Hispanic. The trend has shown that Catholicism is shrinking due to retention. Stewardship and adoration help, but for every 1 newly Baptized at Easter, 6 leave. The study showed that the fastest growing group in America are called NONES- no affiliation. Catholic is the largest denomination, fallen away Catholics is the 2nd largest.

Fr Adam shared a book by Sherry Weddell, 'Forming Intentional Disciples'. Sherry wants our church to "get out the maintenance mode, one that looks like it is dying, and into the mission mode, people who are willing to share their faith joyfully- a Church that loves their faith, loves Jesus and loves their fellow people." Parishes need to be hubs of evangelization! Schools should revolutionize our way of thinking! Fr. Adam said that he has had easier response talking to his public school Catholics than his Parochial school Catholics. That says a lot- are we forming our kids to love their faith, so much so that they easily talk about it?

And what has this to do with Hispanics? Fr Adam said that "the growing face of the Church is more Hispanic. They are here as part of God's mysterious providence." What can we do as Catholics? "Think according to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Be more hospitable to Hispanics, continue outreach in education through the such avenues as the <u>St Katharine Drexel Fund</u>.

To become a 'mission mode' Church, Fr Adam encouraged us watch this video called 'How to Win the Cultural War' by Peter Kreeft, a speech Kreeft gave to Franciscan University of Steubenville students. Fr Adam also implored us to do three things- Pray, Pray, Pray, especially to Our Lady of Guadalupe; to heed the call of Our Lady of Fatima, and pray for the salvation of souls; and to be ready to share your faith! Thank you Fr Adam.


IN MEMORIAM
