

### Who We Are

The Serra Club of North Central Dallas is one of ten Serra clubs that represent Serra International in the local community. There are about 400 members in the ten clubs, with five Serra Clubs in the Dallas Diocese and five in the Fort Worth Diocese.

The North Central club was founded through the efforts of six members from one of the Dallas clubs who obtained a charter from Serra International in November 1985.

Club members have the opportunity to develop friendships and working relationships with active, dedicated Catholics outside of their own parishes. By participating in joint activities with other local clubs, members can interact regularly with Serrans throughout the North Texas area.

### North Central Serra Regular Meetings

The club has two regular functions each month. We meet for Mass at 6:30 AM on the first Friday of each month, followed by breakfast and a monthly business meeting. We meet for dinner at 6:30 PM on the third Monday of each month, followed by a short business meeting and a guest speaker. The club is governed by a Board of Trustees who meet monthly to conduct club business.

#### **Local Area Serra Activities**

The North Central club works on a number of activities throughout the year, including many with the other Dallas and Fort Worth Serra Clubs.


Annual VAP. The primary activity each year is the Vocation Awareness Program, sponsored by the vocations offices of the Dallas and Fort Worth dioceses and organized and managed by the Serrans. VAP is a weekend discernment program each summer for single men and women who are interested in the priesthood or religious life. Serrans work with pastors to publicize the program in the parishes and also participate in VAP weekend activities. Priests, sisters, and brothers who have experience working with vocations conduct the talks, panel discussions, prayers, and consultations during the weekend.

**Seminary Mass.** During the school year, Serrans attend Mass one Sunday each month at Holy Trinity Seminary in Irving. A reception after Mass gives us an opportunity to get acquainted with the seminarians and to encourage their vocation journey. Serrans support and encourage the seminarians in various ways throughout the year.

**Support for Our Religious.** We get to know our priests and other religious and each year join the other Dallas Serra Clubs in showing our appreciation for their vocations by sponsoring an outing and dinner for priests and deacons and an afternoon of entertainment and dinner for the sisters.

**Parish Activities.** Serrans promote vocations in their own parishes and in other area parishes by encouraging prayer and vocation-oriented activities and by providing opportunities for parishioners to be aware of and support vocations within the family as well as the parish community. We encourage each parish to form a vocation committee.

**Prayer for Vocations.** Prayer is the easiest and most effective way all Catholics can support vocations, and our members are active in the "31 Club" program, each selecting a date to attend Mass each month specifically to pray for vocations. We also encourage Catholics in the local parishes to show their support by signing up for the 31 Club.

A highlight each year is the opportunity to meet Serrans from the Texas region and around the world by participating in regional and international conventions. The conventions offer an opportunity to learn more about vocation work and to share ideas with Serrans and well-known Catholic dignitaries and experts in all aspects of church vocations.

Members of our club and the other local clubs have also been very active in Serra at the national and international levels. There are opportunities to serve on the Serra International Board of Trustees and the USA Council Board of Trustees as well as opportunities to serve on committees that develop programs to support local club activities.
