Suggestions for Use

The prayers and readings of this Holy Hour may be used in various ways for private devotion, alone or in groups. To extend the prayers and meditations over an hour's time it is suggested that the oral parts of the holy hour be initiated every ten minutes, followed by silent meditation and adoration. For example,

On the hour: **Opening** of exposition or Opening Song/Hymn

Five minutes after the hour: Reading 1

Fifteen minutes after the hour: Psalm

Twenty-five minutes after the hour: **Reading 2**

Thirty-five minutes after the hour: Gospel Reading

Forty-five minutes after the hour: **Intercessions** for priestly and religious vocations Fifty-five minutes after the hour: **Closing** Prayer and Closing Hymn or close of exposition

(Stand) Gathering Song/ Hymn_____

Leader: Praised be God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Blessed be God forever.

All: Blessed be God forever.

(Be seated) Reading 1 Deuteronomy 32:1-4,7,9-12

Silent reflection

Leader: Let us pray together from Psalm 34, alternating right and left sides.

(Psalm 34:2-11)

 (R) I will bless the Lord at all times; praise shall be always in my mouth.
My soul will glory in the Lord that the poor may hear and be glad.
Magnify the Lord with me; let us exalt his name together.

(L) I sought the Lord, who answered me, delivered me from all my fears.Look to God that you may be radiant with joy and your faces may not blush for shame.

 (R) In my misfortune I called, the Lord heard and saved me from all distress.
The angel of the Lord, who encamps with them, delivers all who fear God.

 (L) Fear the Lord, you holy ones; nothing is lacking to those who fear him.
The powerful grow poor and hungry, but those who seek the Lord lack no good thing.

(Be seated. Oral reflection may be read. Priest or deacon may give a homily.)

(Kneel or be seated) Silent meditation and adoration

(Stand) Leader: Let us pray to our heavenly Father for the needs of the world and for priestly and religious vocations.

Leader: For the Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI, and for all bishops, that God will give them the grace and wisdom to touch the lives and hearts of many during this Year of Faith, we pray...

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: For the Church throughout the world, that this Year of Faith may be a time of spiritual renewal and personal encounter with Christ for people everywhere, we pray...

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: May the Holy Spirit guide the Church during the Year of Faith so that all Catholics may experience a deepened renewal of faith, hope and love, we pray...

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: As this Year of Faith begins, may it be a time of an outpouring of the Holy Spirit on all parents, catechists, clergy and lay faithful who share the gift of the faith with others, we pray...

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: May this Year of Faith fill our parish community with an outpouring of virtue, we pray...

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: May the faithful grow in understanding and love of the calls to marriage and the single life, realizing the vital role these vocations play in the work of evangelization, we pray...

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: May young people be inspired by this Year of Faith to listen attentively and respond to God's call to priesthood and religious life, we pray...

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: This we pray You, Father, through Your Son, Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

Leader: Mary, Model of Faith,

All: Pray for us.
